

**THE WINNIE AND FRANK HARVEY SCHOLARSHIP  
OF COMMUNITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH,  
ATLANTIC BEACH, FLORIDA**

**2010 APPLICATION FOR SENIORS**

**PURPOSE**

The purpose of the award is to motivate high school students to attend regionally accredited two or four-year colleges or universities and to support the recipients' continued success by relieving them of some financial pressure during and after their college years.

**SOURCE OF FUND**

The fund was established in 2000 as a memorial to **Winnie and Frank Harvey** and in recognition of the importance they placed on higher education and their lifetime commitment to Community Presbyterian Church, Atlantic Beach. Even before the organization of CPC, Winnie and Frank Harvey were members of the Community Sunday School, meeting in the old town hall of Atlantic Beach. Their Christian dedication to Community Presbyterian Church was only equaled by their shared opinion of the great importance of higher education, a cherished value they instilled in their own children and grandchildren. These two loved each other and others, including their family, just as Our Lord commanded.

**Frank Newton Harvey** (1906-1983) was the youngest of six surviving children from West Blocton, a small Alabama town. In spite of the family's modest means, his entire sibling group earned post-secondary degrees; this was always a point of pride for the extended Harvey family. After graduating from Locust Grove Military Institute in central Georgia, Frank earned his dental degree from Atlanta Southern College, now Emory University. Frank financed his education by selling Bibles door to door. After serving as an officer in the Army Air Corps in W.W.II, he practiced general dentistry in Jacksonville until he retired in 1976. Frank was an honest, sincere, "gentle" man, who revered education of all kinds.

**Winnie White Harvey** (1909-1999) was born in Memphis, TN, moved to Jacksonville when she was twelve, and was a member of the first graduating class of Lee High School. She attended Florida State College for Women, now Florida State University; however, with her family's financial stress during the depression, she willingly withdrew from FSCW, so that her younger brother, Kenneth P. White, could attend the University of Florida. Yet, Winnie always regretted not completing her education and relished her studies, her sorority, Alpha Chi Omega, and her college friendships. She often recounted her delight in her studies, especially astronomy, zoology and botany. Throughout her life, she found personal applications for all she had learned at FSCW; in fact, she always kept learning, even to the end of her days. In this, she taught her children and her grandchildren to love learning and to honor education. Always with a generous and selfless spirit, Winnie quietly lived Jesus' command, "Love One Another".

Frank and Winnie encouraged and supported their children through college, enabling them to attend nationally acclaimed institutions of their own choosing across the country, and all four children eventually earned advanced graduate degrees. For a time, Charles (Mac), Reese, Lavinia and David were all faculty members at various universities, performing research, serving the academic community and teaching graduate and undergraduate students.

For Winnie, education, like the worship of God, was a cherished experience and an essential pleasure, an activity that enriched one's life by expanding awareness and appreciation for the Creation and by making one a better person, better able to fulfill God's will. She was a loving, giving person to anyone in need. Learning and worship she pursued all her days, and these values she and Frank passed on as a legacy to their children and grandchildren. In this spirit of the importance of education, these gifts are now offered to others.

# **2010 APPLICATION FOR SENIORS**

## **THE AWARD**

The scholarship amount is a per semester award for undergraduate study, renewable for up to 8 semesters including the term of the initial award. This award is intended to supplement the educational costs to attend a regionally-accredited two or four-year college/university within the United States. The recipient must commence college/university study (and therefore the dispersal of the award must begin) by the fall term of the year the recipient graduates from high school.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

1. Member of Community Presbyterian Church for at least one year prior to the application deadline OR a direct descendant of Winnie and Frank Harvey (up to the 5<sup>th</sup> generation). Contact CPC office if you have questions about your CPC confirmation/membership date.
2. United States citizen.
3. High school senior with a minimum 2.8 GPA on an unweighted 4.0 scale.
4. Minimum SAT score of 1000 on Critical Reading and Math tests. (The highest Critical Reading score and the highest Math score will be used to calculate the composite score, if the SAT has been taken more than once. Scores on SAT writing component will not be considered.)
5. Completion of 45 total hours of community service during freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior years (through April 19, 2010).
6. Desire to attend a regionally accredited two or four-year college or university.

## **REQUIRED SUBMITTALS (To be submitted in one packet to CPC office ON OR BEFORE APRIL 19, 2010.)**

1. Completed 2010 Student Application Form. Please type, if possible. Available online at [www.cpcab.org](http://www.cpcab.org) in the College section.
2. Verification of Community Service Form (available in high school guidance offices).
3. One Completed Recommendation Form by Guidance Counselor (in sealed envelope). Submit to counselor by March 1, 2010; at least 6 weeks before the application deadline (April 19, 2010).
4. Two Completed Personal Recommendations Forms (in sealed envelopes). Note: The recommendation from a CPC staff member should be submitted by the staff member directly to the Harvey Scholarship Committee.
5. Complete Official High School Transcript for the 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and first semester grades for 12<sup>th</sup> grade.
6. Copy of the secondary school test results, verifying SAT scores.
7. Copy of the complete SAR (Student Aid Report) based on 2010-2011 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) available in high school guidance offices after January 1. SAR must indicate the EFC (Expected Family Contribution). Can be processed online at: [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Processing time may take several days.
8. Five Essays.

## **SELECTION CRITERIA**

1. Academic Merit: 35% (Based on GPA and SAT score.)
2. Financial Need: 35% (Based on SAR/FAFSA.)
3. Personal Qualities: 30% (Based on CPC involvement, activities, recommendations, and essays.)

## **PAYMENT OF FUNDS**

A final high school transcript, specifying an unweighted GPA (Grade Point Average) of at least 2.8 on a 4.0 scale was maintained during the recipient's senior year of high school, must be submitted before any dispersal of funds. Proof of registration as a full-time student, must also be submitted before dispersal of funds. Scholarship amounts will be dispersed each term beginning with the fall term of the freshman year.

## **RENEWAL OF FUNDS**

The committee must receive a renewal application, official transcript and an official proof of registration after the completion of each term. In order to continue to receive the funds, the recipient must maintain at least a 2.75 term GPA and earn a minimum of 12 semester hours or the equivalent each term.

## **AMENDMENTS**

The Scholarship Committee may revise these guidelines subject to the approval of The Session, Community Presbyterian Church of Atlantic Beach, Florida.

***NOTE: 1) Students need to register for SAT exams well in advance. 2) The FAFSA may require several days to process online. 3) Guidance counselors should receive the recommendation form by March 1, 2010.***
